

### SRJC Foundation Joint Budget & Executive Committee

Unadopted Minutes Wednesday, June 28, 2023 / 8am – 9:30am

- Absent: Kerry Rego
  - Staff: J Mullineaux, Katie Greenwald
  - 1) Call to order Teresa
    - The meeting was called to order at 8:03 am.
  - 2) Public Comment Teresa
    - There were no members of the public present and no comments.
  - 3) Approval of Minutes Teresa
    - Minutes from joint Budget Committee and Executive Committee meeting on 5.10.23 were approved. Motion by Steve, second by Shirley and approved. M/S/P
  - 4) President's Report Dr. Chong
    - Budget passed with an 6.6% cost of living adjustment for SRJC employees, which is staying even with inflation; maintaining healthcare benefits
    - Dr. Chong has been hosting transition meetings with incoming Superintendent/President Dr. Garcia; reports that Dr. Garcia has in-depth knowledge pertaining to student housing and student services (process and law) and that she's looking forward to working with the Foundation. Dr. Garcia will assume office July 5.
    - Zehra Sonkaynar has been promoted from Executive Assistant to Executive Officer to the Board; Sarah Laggos remains interim director of strategic communications through the end of the year
    - Dr. Chong will remain in the office in an Emeritus role through July 12; will stay in this role in a PTO capacity through October 19
    - The Resident's Hall will be completed in time for fall classes with move-in August 11
    - STEM building will be filled in phases (construction delayed due to rain earlier in the year) with chemistry being the last to move in near the end of the semester

## 5) Summarized Balance Sheet - Kate

The Statements shared include information as of May 31, 2023. As compared to Statements ending March 31:

- Total assets decreased by \$160K to \$80.5M due to changes in income and expenditures
- Liabilities increased by \$180K to \$1.81M, primarily due to a reduction in accounts payable and changes in funds that are held in trust for custodial accounts and events
- Total income to-date increased by \$484K to \$9.14M, primarily due to interest and dividend income of \$15K, \$38K in other income, \$32K in unrestricted contributions, and \$398K in scholarship contributions
- Expenditures increased by \$823K to \$7.66M, primarily due to an increase of \$165K in scholarship payments and \$658K in admin and other operating expenses
  - o Ex: Foundation contributed \$135K toward the scoreboard

## 6) 22/23 Budget to Actual – J

- J announced that the foundation has experienced YOY revenue growth since he joined the foundation in 2019
- Projected to close the year at \$10M in revenue, originally a stretch goal in Strat Plan



- Reflection on Accomplishments in FY22/23:
  - We're in a new building; hosted a dedication
  - We're back to being in-person full time; rebuilding relationships with donors
  - We went from having no events due to COVID to hosting a number of events, including a celebratory President's Address, honoring Dr. Chong's legacy
  - We've moved standing committees from Trusts to ad hoc committees Friends Of AG, Friends of Petaluma and To-Be-Named "Bear Club Athletic Association"
  - With the help of Teresa and the board, we've developed a rubric and training for scholarship reviewers which will result in a more equitable and fairer program

- We're ending the year with a surplus after anticipating a deficit, primarily due to a reduction in staffing costs (Sarah Laggos' role being split between the District and Foundation; coordinator role remaining vacant for part of the year)
- The Budget to Actual reflects projected year-end figures
  - Total revenue remains mostly unchanged from early in the year, due to unrestricted fund balance
  - Slight deficit on Presidents' Address budget, made up for in other parts of the budget
  - Expected \$96K in Net Revenue Over Expenses
- If this surplus is realized, the Foundation recommends applying fifty percent (50%) of it to unrestricted funds per the new policy; Executive Committee agrees
  - o Process to be implemented with a requisition in FY 23/24

# 7) Governance – Teresa

- Board Orientation on 7/7: New Board Members Evan Hershey and Troy Sanderson

   Suzy, Teresa and J to meet with these two new Foundation Board Members to
   review the board overview and binder elements
  - o Hershey and Sanderson will assume positions on 7/1
- Board Orientation: Dr. Garcia
  - o J and Dr. Garcia will meet 1:1 meeting date TBD
- Board Recruitment
  - Nominating Committee will meet in August; looking to fill three spots for next fiscal year
  - Team is considering some potential asks; asking for more contacts looking for Sonoma County AG connections to replace previous board members
     Dr. Garcia to be consulted for input as well
- Board Retreat: Sept 21
  - o Suzy, J, Teresa to meet next week to discuss the topic; Foundation determining venue
  - Agenda to include some business at the front: Approval of FY23/24 budget; Review of final FY22/23 Statements; Update on Strategic Plan
- July Foundation Board Meeting: July 20
  - o First meeting of next fiscal;
  - o Topic: Scholarship team presentation
    - Presenting team to be provided with guidance on interests of this audience; focus on human interest rather than program detail
- Scholarships
  - o Scholarship team hiring a new manager; J to be a member of the search committee

- **8)** Philanthropy Update J
  - We're ahead of where we were last year; \$2M in endowments; highest since J has been leading the Foundation
  - The five-year forecast originally assumed \$800K, which was stretched to \$1M; Achieved \$2M; Will realize one additional month of Doyle dividends before EOY
  - Final audit reports to be different from final Income Statement due to reporting of custodial funds
  - Scholarship funds 3 types:
    - 4500: in / outs
    - 4600: multiyear (for example: \$10K over 5 years)
    - 4700: in progress continuing to raise the full \$25K; donor directed
  - Events continue to bring in revenue; Annuities and bequests continue to support the Foundation's mission; Increased pledges due to Measure H projects (3 years support to student housing, for example)
  - The Student Success line includes mostly scholarships, Second Chance, and Health Occupation Preparation and Education Program, among more
- **9)** Other Business
  - Student Housing
    - The new Student Housing facility is 95% full as of a couple of weeks ago, expected to reach 100%; Up to 50 previously unhoused students will have a home with this facility
    - August 11 move-in date; ribbon cutting TBD; Once building is open, community / board tours will continue
  - Board Installation Dinner
    - Teresa will welcome everyone and make a few remarks; J has a prepared statement about EOY results and staff acknowledgement
  - Foundation Intern
    - Launching a Foundation Fellow paid employment opportunity with the goal of supporting the Foundation and helping to build a pipeline of philanthropy professionals from diverse backgrounds; 10,000 Degrees and internal departments will help promote and recruit
    - Fellow will join the Foundation from October 2023 May / June 2024 and report to Constituent Relations Coordinator
