

# LETTER FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR & BOARD CHAIR

As the community began to emerge from the confines of the pandemic in 2021-2022, SRJC gradually welcomed students, faculty, and staff back to campus. The return of in-person learning and services brought much-needed energy and connection back to the College. Though new and lingering challenges remain, a sense of hope has been restored as we navigate our "new normal" together.

Though uncertainty and caution remained strong, so too did the loyalty and generosity of our donor community. In 2021-2022, the SRJC Foundation received more than \$8.9 million to support students and programs and awarded more than \$4.3 million in scholarships to deserving students from its endowment, non-endowed funds, and the Doyle Trust Scholarship Fund.

The SRJC Foundation secured several notable major gifts, including a \$300,000 endowed gift for swimming and diving programs to name the new 50-meter Olympic-sized pool, a bequest for \$150,000 that established an endowed fund for the purchase of musical instruments, a \$100,000 gift to the newly-created endowment for Student Housing, and a grant of \$500,000 to benefit new Wildfire Resilience programs.

The return to campus also meant a return to (modified) events. The SRJC Foundation hosted a 50th Anniversary event for Shone Farm, the new "Building Futures" event to benefit the Petaluma campus, the annual golf tournament to benefit Athletics, and the President's Address to the Community luncheon where Pam Chanter was honored as the recipient of the President's Medallion.

In October, SRJC President Dr. Frank Chong announced his intent to retire in summer 2023 after leading the College for more than a decade. We hope you will join us in celebrating his many important achievements at this year's President's Address and Celebration event on June 1, 2023 at Shone Farm.

While we enjoyed increased social activity, markets experienced disappointing investment activity. FY21/22 saw record-setting inflation and aggressive rate hikes, resulting in a loss of 12.59% for the invested portfolio of the SRJC Foundation managed by Graystone Consulting. However, we are proud to report that total fund performance since inception remained positive at 6.38% and the portfolio value at the end of the fiscal year was near \$60 million. We continue to focus on the long-term success and sustainability of the Endowment funds as we incorporate ESG (Environmental, Social, Governance) policy criteria into portfolio management.

Perhaps the most exciting transition for the SRJC Foundation in the past year has been the move to our new office on campus at 707 Elliott Ave. We hope you will join us for food, wine, and fun to celebrate our new space at our Building Dedication on March 30th, 5-7pm, featuring the unveiling of a mural by SRJC alumna Maria de Los Angeles.

Beyond the new building is the incredible work that goes on within. And, beyond the names and numbers provided in this report, you will see personal stories of students and donors who have experienced the power of philanthropy and the promise of higher education. Thank you for being an important part of these stories (and countless more to come) through your commitment to SRJC students and programs.

# WELCOME TO POLLY HALL

In our last annual report, we shared exciting plans for new affordable student housing on campus. We're thrilled to share that the building is now nearing completion and we're preparing for students to move into their new home this Fall.

We are even more delighted to share that in December 2022, the Sonoma County **Junior College District Board of Trustees** approved the naming of the building as the Polly O'Meara Dovle Hall, to be known affectionately as "Polly Hall." This naming followed the SRJC Scholarship Committee's approval of the creation of a new \$400,000 annual Doyle Housing Scholarship for students who will live in the dorms, which will provide up to \$1,200 per student per year.

# Polly O'Meara Doyle was one of fourteen

women with the Federated Home and School Association who in 1917 came together and recommended the formation of a junior college in Santa Rosa. The Sonoma County Board of Education approved their recommendation three days later. Polly's marriage and partnership with Frank Doyle made her an important part of a "team of two" with a mission to ensure that the college would continue to serve its community in the best way possible.

SRJC President Dr. Frank Chong said "The entire Doyle family has a longstanding legacy at SRJC, including the Doyle Trust, which has provided scholarships to thousands of students totaling more that \$100 million since its inception. I am deeply appreciative that the SRJC Scholarship Committee supported the creation of a new scholarship that will help make this housing even more affordable for our students."

The goal of Polly O'Meara Doyle Hall is to specifically address housing insecurity issues for low-income students. Any student enrolled in six or more units is eligible to apply for housing with priority given to: low-income and first-generation college students, current and former homeless students, foster youth, disabled students, active military, and veterans.



All student residents will be eligible to apply for the Doyle Housing Scholarship and for additional support from the Student Support Endowment, a fund created to subsidize housing costs and lower rental rates for our most vulnerable students, and to provide for other basic needs like food and transportation as well as essential programs like medical and mental health services.

The physical building is already transforming the Santa Rosa campus, and everything that goes on inside will undoubtedly transform countless lives in our community. Several generous supporters have stepped forward with funding for the Student Support Endowment, naming spaces within Polly Hall that will be recognized by all who live and visit the building.

Would you like to join Polly and other community leaders as part of this historic project with immeasurable impact? There are several spaces within Polly Hall available for naming, including the lobby, outdoor plaza, lounges, kitchens, and more. With your support, we will not only offer affordable housing for students, but deliver affordable living, and make it sustainable so that students can continue to live, study, work, and thrive in Sonoma County.

# SCHOLARSHIP STORIES

Scholarships will always be a core part of why the SRJC Foundation exists. The scholarship department currently offers more than 600 SRJC Foundation scholarships in addition to the incomparable Doyle Scholarship, thanks to the legacy of Frank P. Doyle and Polly O'Meara Doyle and the generosity of our many loyal donors. In FY 21/22 alone, the Santa Rosa Junior College Foundation awarded more than \$4.3 million in scholarships to deserving students, helping them to stay in school and focused on their studies so that they can achieve their dreams. With the completion of just a single application, SRJC students are automatically considered for ALL scholarships for which they are eligible. In FY 21/22, as most California colleges continued to deal with enrollment challenges due to the pandemic, we were able to work with SRJC donors to expand a majority of scholarships intended for full-time students to also include students enrolled half-time. We are especially grateful to donors who agreed to make the change permanent, allowing access to our largest student population. More than 72% of scholarship applicants for FY 21/22 were selected for one or more awards; 2,658 students received the Doyle scholarship, and 1,866 students were awarded Foundation scholarships.



As a low income, first generation Latina STEM student who wants to go into the medical field, the question of how to afford college has always been a barrier to my dreams. Thanks to scholarship donors, I transferred from SRJC this year to UC Davis and am pursuing my bachelors in biochemistry and molecular biology. Without the help of these wonderful donors, I would not be where I am today.



I am a dental hygiene student at SRJC. Scholarships have really helped me get through the program, reduce my financial worries, and help me pay for school. It's a very intensive program and the support from donors alleviates so much of my stress so I can focus on my classes and homework.

# SCHOLARSHIP STORIES

Many SRJC scholarship recipients receive more than just financial support from scholarship donors - they also receive inspiration and encouragement from the stories behind the support.

In 2021, Karen Mejia Pennrich and her family established a SRJC scholarship specifically for a nursing student in honor of her niece, Ana Cristina Melgar. Ana was an intelligent young woman whose lifelong dream was to become a nurse and help others, especially children. Although it was a challenge to complete the SRJC nursing program due to the pandemic and her need to work while attending classes, she persevered and completed the program in December 2021. Tragically, she unexpectedly passed away in January 2022. Ana's family established the Ana Melgar Nursing Scholarship in her name to honor and remember her, and her desire to become a nurse. Although Ana is no longer with us and her dream to become a nurse will be unfulfilled, her legacy will live on in the scholarship to support nurses who will help countless others for generations to come.

SRJC nursing student Gisel Lopez was selected as the first recipient of the Ana Melgar Nursing Scholarship. She has been in communication with Karen and has learned about the namesake of the scholarship she received.



# A LEGACY OF LOVE FOR SRJC



Jack Farmer had many important roles at SRJC: successful student, longtime employee, beloved colleague, retiree-turned-frequent-visitor, and impactful donor. The college was like a second home to Jack, who was advised and mentored as a student by Academic Vice President Brook Tauzer and Superintendent/President Randolph Newman. After several part-time jobs on campus, Jack went on to serve as a custodian in the John Lounibos Center for nearly 28 years. Jack loved to ride his bike around the SRJC neighborhood and campus, often hauling huge sacks of aluminum cans he'd redeem for funds to save and invest in the community. He was known for being a friendly visitor who always had stories to tell, often of his time in the US Army and at SRJC. He was proud of his affiliation with the College, often wearing favorites from his large collection of SRJC shirts and caps. Jack lived humbly in order to save and invest, and with guidance from trusted professionals, was able to make significant annuity gifts to the College.

Sadly, Jack passed away in November 2022. Jack's name lives on at SRJC on the plagues bearing his name in the Bertolini Student Center, the Burdo Culinary Arts Center, and the Doyle Library. More importantly, his legacy of love for SRJC lives on through the impact of his considerable contributions that will help students in need for generations to come.




